WHO CAN ATTEND THE JAMBOREE?

Confirming details previously supplied. To attend the Jamboree as a Youth Member, you must be:

- 10 years old (or older), on 1 June 2018, and
- 17 years old (or younger) on 30 September 2018.

Girls who will be 14 years old on 30 September 2018 can choose to be placed in a patrol of Guides aged 10–14 years old or in a patrol of Guides aged 14–17 years old.

Girls who are in their final year of school (HSC or equivalent) will have the option of attending for a shorter time. These girls may attend Sunday—Tuesday if they do not wish to stay for the complete time. No other part-time attendance will be possible for Youth Members. This option will be available to the girls when submitting their applications.

Members who are 18 years old (or older) on 30 September 2018 can attend as Adults.

Adults will have the option to attend the Jamboree for the full week, single days, or part days.

DATABASE

The Application Database should be open by the end of May 2017.

To answer some queries already received:

Can I be in a Patrol with my friends?

Yes. Girls will be able to list one or two of their friends they would like to be patrolled with. Girls will need to chat with their friends to ensure they all want to be patrolled together and are in the same age range ie 1014 or 1417. During the application process girls will be asked to provide the name and Application Registration Number of the other girl/s. We will then be able to link them together when forming Patrols of five girls.

Can I choose my activity?

Yes. Depending on if you are 1014 or 1417 the correct set of excursions/expeditions will be in the camping section of the application. You will be asked to choose three (out of 15 options) in order of your preference.

Is there a cost for extra activities?

In most cases, no there is no further cost.

Any additional costs for particular activities will be clearly shown on the application database.

When are the payments due?

The first deposit is due in July 2017, second deposit is due in November 2017 and final payment must be received by 31st March, 2018. Participants are able to make payments at any time using the payment system on the application database. Full payment can be made at any stage. Participants can begin their application process in 2018 but still pay in full by the end of March 2018.

Can I be on a Sub Camp with a specific person?

Yes. Leaders/Managers can apply either as part of a full sub camp team by providing the name and Application Registration Number of their Sub Camp Leader OR of the one or two other Leaders/Managers you would like to be in a sub camp with.

What are the Sub Camp roles?

Sub Camp teams of five will be Sub Camp Leader, Program, Caterer, Caterer, First Aid.

How is Central Group going to be arranged?

All adults not assigned to a role on a Group or Sub Camp team will be part of Central Group.

This is a vital Group providing support to all areas of Sydney Jamboree 2018.

Adults will be rostered each day to specific areas, depending on the needs of each Team.

Eg. If all participants are leaving the site, extra people will be rostered to assist Security and Logistics with the process of leaving the site.

If all are on site, extra adults will be rostered to assist the Program team with on-site activities.

How will the application process work?

After the application process is started, Members will be able to log in and out numerous times until all sections have been completed. Each initial application will generate a Registration Number. This is NOT the Jamboree Number which will be generated at a later stage

Once submitted on-line, applications will be classified as 'prospective'.

State Liaisons / Contingent Leaders will then be able to see which Members of their states have applied so can run membership and WWC checks and will then need to approve the applications.

In the database system, applications then appear to the Jamboree as prospective participants from each state who appear as 'approved with a role' (for adults) and 'approved' (for youth Members).

All participants will be required to print their Jamboree Participant Agreement.

These agreements ensure that all participants are aware of the positive behaviours, Code of Conduct and site induction requirements.

Youth Members will be required to provide signatures from a parent / guardian and their Unit Leader.

Adult Members will be required to provide signatures from a District Manager and Region Manager (or another member of the Region Team).

Signed Jamboree Participant Agreements will then be posted to Sydney Jamboree Administration.

Once received and processed, applications will appear as 'accepted', groups and patrols will be arranged and choice activities allocated ... all in preparation for a great Sydney Jamboree 2018.
